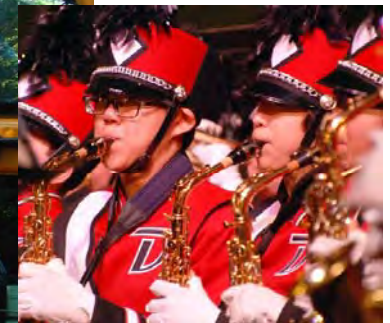

5. Referring to student impact and building utilization tables, are the changes worth the disruption created? Might students need to be redistricted again in the near future?
6. Does the option maintain diversity among schools with regard to minority and FARMS percentages?
7. Does the option adequately respond to other considerations not listed here?
