What is the structure of the Superintendent's Student Advisory Council?

The Superintendent's Student Advisory Council is composed of high school students representing the geographical areas of the county.

What is the process for students interested in serving on the Superintendent's Student Advisory Council?

If you are interested in serving on the advisory council, submit an application. The deadline for submission of applications for the 2017-2018 advisory council is **Friday, June 9, 2017**.

How are members chosen to serve?

To ensure broad representation, the applications for potential members will be evaluated on a variety of factors, including geographic location of school, grade level, and areas of interest.

When will the Superintendent's Student Advisory Council meetings be held?

The meetings will be held quarterly during the school year in the Administration Building, Greenwood campus, from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m.

What will be expected of the Superintendent's Student Advisory Council?

Advisory members will be expected to:

- Attend all scheduled meetings.
- Prepare for each meeting as needed.
- Work in a collaborative manner with each other and with school system staff.
- Express views and opinions openly, constructively, and respectfully.

Although staff will develop an agenda for each meeting, students may submit discussion items for consideration to the chief of staff.
