If inclement weather conditions force us to close schools more than seven days, it will be

necessary to alter the school calendar. These additional days will be scheduled as required at the end of the school year. The calendar will be reduced up to 5 days if not needed to offset days/hours when schools are closed due to inclement weather. **Teacher duty days will not exceed 191.** One-half days may be modified for inclement weather/emergency conditions.
