#### POLICY ANALYSIS FOR BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY 5470 <u>Wellness</u>

#### **Statement of Issues or Questions Addressed**

In accordance with Board of Education Policy and Superintendent's Rule 8130, Policy 5470 is scheduled for review on school year 2011-2012. The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (NSLA), codified at 42 U.S.C. §1758b, mandates that local education agencies participating in the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program (which would include the Board of Education of Baltimore County) establish a local school wellness policy. The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 added Section 9A to the NSLA which incorporates new requirements for the implementation, dissemination, and assessment of this policy. The requirements outlined in the Act are incorporated in the policy revisions, including: (1)involvement of the community by designating the Baltimore County School Health Council in the development of the policy and its implementing procedures; (2) notice to the public about the content and implementation of the policy; and (3) a mandate that staff monitor compliance with the policy. The Policy has further been edited to include a philosophy statement and to comply with the Policy Review Committee's editing conventions.

#### STUDENTS: Services to Students

#### Wellness

- I. PHILOSOPHY
  - A. The Board of Education of Baltimore County (BOARD) IS COMMITTED TO PROVIDING A SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT THAT [supports student and staff wellness in order to] promoteS students' health, well-being, and ability to learn BY SUPPORTING HEALTHY EATING AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY. THE BOARD RECOGNIZES THAT STUDENTS NEED ACCESS TO HEALTHFUL FOODS AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY, HEALTH AND COUNSELING SERVICES, WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE FAMILY AND COMMUNITY IN ORDER TO GROW, LEARN, AND THRIVE. THE BOARD RECOGNIZES THAT GOOD HEALTH REDUCES ABSENTEEISM, IMPROVES TEST SCORES, AND ENHANCES STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.
  - B. THE BOARD BELIEVES SCHOOLS HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE. STUDENTS DEVELOP HELP AND ATTITUDES NECESSARY TO ADOPT AND MAINTAIN A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE AND ENCOURAGES EMPLOYEES TO SERVE AS ROLE MODELS FOR STUDENTS BY MAINTAINING HEALTHY LIFESTYLES. IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE THIS GOAL, THE BOARD SUPPORTS programs promoting student AND STAFF wellness [are encouraged] through coordinated school health initiatives involving the eight components of coordinated school health:
    - 1. School health services
    - 2. Healthy school environment
    - 3. Health education
    - 4. Coordinated student support services
    - 5. Employee wellness
    - 6. Physical education AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY
    - 7. Food and nutrition serviceS
    - 8. Community collaboration
- II. DEFINITION
  - A. CONSISTENT WITH THE *HEALTHY, HUNGER-FREE KIDS ACT OF* 2010, BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY 5470, ALONG WITH ITS IMPLEMENTING SUPERINTENDENT'S RULE, SHALL CONSTITUTE THE SCHOOL SYSTEM'S *LOCAL WELLNESS POLICY*.

#### III. IMPLEMENTATION

- A. The [Board of Education directs the] Superintendent SHALL [to develop rules to] implement this LOCAL WELLNESS Policy BY ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES THAT RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF IMPLEMENTING HEALTH AND WELLNESS ACTIVITIES.
- B. THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL SEEK THE ADVICE OF THE BALTIMORE COUNTY SCHOOL HEALTH COUNCIL REGARDING SCHOOL HEALTH, NUTRITION, AND WELLNESS MATTERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF, OR REVISION OF, THIS POLICY AND ITS IMPLEMENTING PROCEDURES.
- C. THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL DESIGNATE A MEMBER OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF TO MONITOR COMPLIANCE WITH THIS WELLNESS POLICY AND ITS RELATED RULE. SUCH DESIGNEE SHALL REPORT TO THE SUPERINTENDENT REGARDING THE SCHOOL SYSTEM'S COMPLIANCE WITH THIS POLICY AND RELATED PROCEDURES.
- D. THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL INFORM AND UPDATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE CONTENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS POLICY.
